Opening date revealed for Liverpool Hospital's new car park

Liverpool Hospital's new car park will open to staff, patients and the community on


Thursday 15 September from 6am.

From this time, the former P2 car park off Campbell Street will permanently close and will no longer be accessible. It will be replaced with the new P2 car park, see map below.

Access to the new P2 car park will be via the spiral ramp off Burnside Drive.

Key information:

- Visitors will be required to use the new P2 car park for hospital parking, accessible between 6am to 10pm daily, via Burnside Drive.
- Pedestrian access from the car park to the hospital will be via Entrance J, open 24 hours.
- P3 car park remains available for public parking, accessible between 6am to 10pm daily, via Burnside Drive.



- Drop-off areas will remain available at Entrances L and N off Campbell Street during entrance opening hours. Entrance J drop-off is available 24 hours.
- Please allow extra travel time for appointments when parking at the hospital.

First concrete pour marks a new milestone

The \$790 million Liverpool Hospital redevelopment has achieved an exciting milestone with its first concrete slab pour, involving 300 cubic metres of concrete.

It is the first of six pours needed to complete the ground floor that will be home to the future expansion of the Emergency Department (ED).

Staff and patients will soon begin to see a building rise from the Liverpool Hospital construction site with more than 25 pours scheduled throughout the next nine months.

Director of Emergency Medicine Alex Mackey said the first slab was an exciting milestone for the Emergency Department team and in the construction of the new hospital building.

"Our Emergency Department will almost double in size and we will be providing the best care for our community with new state-of-the-art facilities." Mr Mackey said.

Meet Binyang, our newly named tower crane!

The 52-metre tower crane has officially been named as 'Binyang' at the Crane Naming Ceremony which will support construction of a new hospital building, as part of the first stage of the \$790 million Liverpool Health and Academic Precinct project.

The traditional Dharug name means "bird" - celebrating the abundance of bird species found across the region.

The winning name was selected from our Name the Crane competition. where more than 100 entries were received from primary schools across the region.

Competition winner Bella Bui and Green Valley Public School Principal Brett Warwick were awarded a \$500 voucher at the event for their school to purchase educational resources such as sports equipment or library books Bella was also awarded an individual \$100 voucher.

Liverpool Hospital General Manager Karen McMenamin said the competition provided an opportunity for the hospital to engage with local students and schools during construction of the new hospital.

"Congratulations to Bella for being selected amongst such strong competition," Ms McMenamin said.

"I'm hopeful that being part of the project will encourage some of our local students to think about a future career in health."
