



Sod turn marks latest redevelopment milestone

NSW Minister for Health Brad Hazzard joined Member for Holsworthy Melanie Gibbons at Liverpool Hospital in early December to mark the start of construction on the hospital's new \$50 million multi-storey car park.

Development applications for both the multi-storey car park and Liverpool Health and Academic Precinct main works are now approved, paving the way for on-ground works to commence.

Turning the first sod alongside NSW Government representatives, Liverpool Hospital General Manager Karen McMenamin said the new car park would be a welcome addition to the campus on completion in 2022.

"Commencement of construction on the new car park is a significant milestone in the delivery of the broader Liverpool Health and Academic Precinct project, with a total of \$790 million being invested in the redevelopment of Liverpool Hospital to enhance services and facilities in support of the growing community," Ms McMenamin said.

The multi-storey car park will help meet the projected growth associated with the redevelopment, enhance the quality of car parking

facilities, and improve accessibility to health services for patients and their families.

ADCO Constructions Pty Ltd has been awarded the contract for the seven-storey car park, which will provide an additional 500 parking spaces for the campus.

The Liverpool Health and Academic Precinct project will see the redevelopment of Liverpool Hospital into a world class health, research and education precinct, creating thousands of jobs during construction to 2026 and beyond. Main works construction is due to commence in early 2021.

Colourful addition to site

Commencement of works to construct our new multi-storey car park will soon see the installation of fencing around the perimeter of the building site.

With construction set to continue until early 2022, Health Infrastructure and builders ADCO have embraced the opportunity to incorporate the work of contemporary Aboriginal artist Danielle Mate Sullivan into the site's hoarding design.

The artwork (pictured above) celebrates the Georges River, which features strongly across both Gandangarra and Dharawal lands and has been a source of food and water for thousands of years. The river was also a significant meeting place for Aboriginal people, as well as a place for trade.

The aerial perspective depicts the waters of the river, along with meeting places and those gathering at them – reflecting both past and present.




New road configuration

If you've visited the hospital in recent months you may have noticed a hive of activity in the vicinity of Entrance J, with significant road works underway to construct a new road network servicing the eastern boundary of the campus.

A new road connecting Burnside Drive and Elizabeth Street is now operational, with alternate routes in place to access key services and facilities.

Access to the hospital loading dock, Entrance E and Entrance G services (Isolation Dialysis and Transit Lounge) is now via Burnside Drive. A new bridge connection to eastern campus is also operational.

In mid-December, the installation of site fencing around the new multi-storey car park construction site will see the closure of the P2 entry/exit gates accessed via Burnside Drive, with entry/exit via Forbes Street only.
