Transforming Liverpool Hospital

It is an exciting time for the local community, with the NSW Government investing \$830 million for the redevelopment of Liverpool Hospital. As one of the state's biggest infrastructure projects, the precinct is boosting the local economy and positioning Liverpool Hospital as a global hub for innovation and medical research.

The precinct is transforming the experience of patients, staff, and the community through high-quality personalised care, state-of-the-art equipment, and purposebuilt facilities. It also celebrates the region's vibrant multicultural community through the integration of arts and culture.

How will Liverpool benefit from the redevelopment?

The redevelopment provides enhanced healthcare and services close to home, with expanded clinical services, public spaces, and parking. Integrated research and teaching facilities ensure Liverpool Hospital meets the needs of the growing community.

Employment opportunities generated during construction and after completion will further boost the local economy, while staff will benefit from working in contemporary facilities that support their professional development.

Key features

Stage 1

Completed in October 2024, Stage 1 delivered the new Integrated Services Building, which includes:

- New birthing unit
- New neonatal intensive care unit
- New pathology department
- Additional medical imaging department
- New pharmacy
- Outpatient clinics and support services
- New public entrance

Stage 2

Stage 2 is underway, with construction expected to be completed in 2027.

A second integrated services building will feature:

- Integrated cancer centre
- Expanded maternity, women's and children's services
- Increased ambulatory care services and outpatient clinics
- Retail outlets and conference facilities

Minimising Disruptions

Patients will continue to receive high-quality care throughout the redevelopment. Disruptions will be minimised, and those affected will be informed of any planned changes.

Parking Improvements

The new P3 Liverpool Hospital multi-storey car park opened in 2022, providing an additional 500 spaces on campus and improved drop-off and pick-up points from Burnside Drive. The new hospital entrance on Goulburn Street also includes a dedicated drop-off zone and access to the P1 car park. P2 and P3 car parks can be accessed via Burnside Drive.
